Most readers know Prince Edward Island as Anne's Land—home of the precocious, red-headed orphan from the imagination of L.M. Montgomery. I can hardly fault them. *Anne of Green Gables* drew me to the island too. It was the gentle, quiet pace that kept me coming back. There's a peacefulness to the island, a security in the knowledge that

I can get lost on a two-lane road that will eventually lead me to the ocean. It's the music that makes me tap my foot and the smile on every face.

Quite honestly, I would have been blissfully unaware if not for Ms. Montgomery too. Well, unaware at least—if not blissfully so. I'd have been unaware of PEI and unaware of what I was missing. My whole world would have been smaller if I had never known about it.

Even if I had never visited PEI, I would have loved it for the way Anne Shirley experienced it in all her delight and exuberance.

This is what books do for us. They show us a world beyond anything we might ever get to see with our own eyes and show us that world through the eyes of new friends. They help us escape the world we know for one we can only imagine. And we love to imagine!


